

To know whether to use *I* or *me* in a sentence such as, "Bob and (I, me) went shopping," *leave out "Bob and."* It is correct to say, "I went shopping." You would not say, "Me went shopping." It is correct to say, "*Bob and I* went shopping."



In a sentence such as, "Give the books to Bob and (I, me)," *leave out "Bob and."* It is correct to say, "Give the books to me." You would not say, "Give the books to I." It is correct say, "Give the books to *Bob and me.*"
